* AMS/Neve surprise merger

Neve Electronics and AMS Industries merged in the UK on October I, though the trading names of Neve and AMS will be retained, along with their respective product identities. The surprise move follows the earlier merger of Neve and AMS in the USA as Siemens Audio Ltd. The new company HQ will be situated at Burnley, Lancashire, with manufacturing continuing at Burnley and at Neve's facility at Kelso, Scotland. Sadly, Neve's newly-built multi-million pound complex in Hertfordshire will undergo a "phased closure", with the loss of around 80 jobs.

MD of the new enterprise will be Mark Crabtree, former MD of AMS; he comments that "the strategy of the new company is to enhance the name and reputation of AMS and Neve jointly, while continuing to support both AMS and Neve product lines utilising the skills and experience of each. All major current products will remain in the new company's portfolio and will

continue to be fully supported. The merger allows us to rationalise the positioning of our products to provide maximum choice and therefore flexibility to our customers.

"The question which has provoked most interest since the announcement of a merger at the AES in Vienna has been our joint strategy for the Logic 2 and Capricorn [digital] consoles. Our position is clear — we will continue to market and support both desks, since to do so allows the maximum possible customer choice."

The merged company has yet to announce a corporate name — this is currently being considered by US parent Siemens.

Prism's DREAM ticket

The first product in Prism Sound's DREAM (Dynamic Range Enhanced Audio Modulator) series of products is the Dream AD-1 high performance A/D conventor. The AD-1 is available in a number of variants offering a range of specifications and facilities. Analogue inputs are transformerless and electronically balanced, with the analogue electronics isolated from the digital to avoid noise pickup and crosstalk. Input level is adjustable with a choice of several fixed ranges and tamper-proof multitum pots which can be de-selected if desired.

To avoid clipping when high level recordings are made, a soft limit function is provided. The DREAM series features wide dynamic range, with the noise floor at -115dB. Noise shaping and Triangular Probability-Density Function (TPDF) dither are among the features provided to enhance the output. Comprehensive support is given for standard digital J/Os, including AES/EBU on XLR and coaxial

formats, and consumer optical format. SDIF-2 outputs are an optional extra. If you have difficulty when using consumer SPDIF formats, the AD-1 can provide simultaneous consumer and pro format outputs as well as having a range of alternative switchable Channel Status implementations.

Synchronisation is available in several options, starting with the AD-1's own precision crystal oscillator. Options are provided for AES 11 Digital Audio Reference Signal on XLR or coax, AES or SPDIF on optical and SDIF-2 word clock. A range of models is available to suit various applications in music recording and broadcast, and all can be fitted with the SDIF-2 interface option.
