AMS Neve will be showing the latest hardware and software developments for its range of digital editing and mixing equipment. Visitors will see the new 16 bit version of the Logic 3 digital mixer. Keeping with AMS Neve's upgrade policy, this option is available to owners of four and eight fader systems.

Version 1.2 AudioFile software, also on show, offers new and improved

features including 24-bit compatibility, more tracks per disk, Virtual Tracks, waveform display, Lightworks 'Live' Replay, and a Multi-Machine Control System. And the latest software release for the Capricorn, Version 2.4, offers users a range of new features and updates to existing functions.

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KRK pursues Far Eastern market

KRK Monitoring Systems will be attending the Pro Audio & Light Asia show in Singapore for the first time this year in an effort to increase their presence in the Far Eastern market. "We're looking to branch out and aggressively begin pursuing business in international markets," says Keith Klawitter, KRK President and Chief Designer. "With the business climate in the Far East currently being so

favourable, it certainly is one of the first markets we'd like to focus our attention toward. We anticipate that this show in Singapore will be an excellent vehicle for us to introduce our monitors to the professional marketplace."

VW Marketing, specialist sales representatives for the Asia Pacific Rim, will display and demonstrate three audio products at PALA '95: the SADiE Digital Audio Editor, the UltraPro three channel valve signal processors and mixing console, and Micron Professional Microphone Systems.

The SADiE digital audio editor is shortly to include a video option, and there will also be a portable SADiE, based on a Pentium PC in a portable case with three drive bays, on show.

The UltraPro, known for their valve EQ, and preamplifiers, have a new Classic 1000 and

Gold mixing desks, which are expandable In Line/Split designs, with a choice of IC, discrete transistor, or valve modules which may be mixed within the same console.

This year will be Micron's first exhibition at PALA. Their microphones are suited for a wide range of applications including broadcast, OB, theatre and film sound, and are a common feature in television studios as well as major theatre productions.

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Four new products from HHB at PALA

Exhibiting for the first time at PALA, HHB will be showing the PortaDAT range of professional portable DAT recorders. HHB's continued commitment to supporting the development of the PortaDAT range is further evidenced at PALA by the launch of the MCA1000, a four-bay fast charger to complement the PortaDAT's already impressive range of powering options.

HHB's audio DAT tape range is now complemented by the DDS90M, a 90 minute data DAT tape receiving its first Asian showing at PALA '95. Developed for use in mass data storage and backup

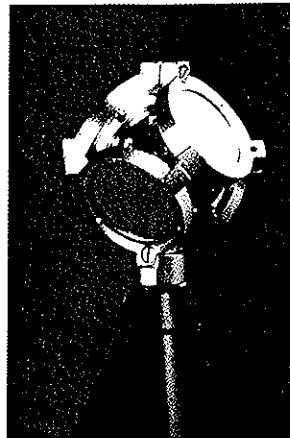

Alongside the HHB BitBox, HHB are showing the CDR74, an advanced 74 minute/680 Mbyte recordable CD, which is fully compatible with the new generation of 6x speed writers. Also receiving its first showing in Asia is the DH-1 De-Hisser from CEDAR Audio. The DH-1 is the fourth in a range of CEDAR real-time processors that already includes the DC-1 De-Clicker,



CR-1 De-Crackler, and AZ-1 Azimuth Corrector.

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SoundField on show



On show will be the SoundField MkV 'single point source' microphone system and the portable ST250 stereo M/S microphone system. Technical Sales Engineer, Richard Bacon will be demonstrating recently written software which graphically displays on screen the accuracy of the polar patterns created by the SoundField four capsule tetrahedral array and associated electronics.

Both the MkV and ST250 control units will be hooked up to the software to demonstrate the differences between XY recording and the Mid & Side approach. Copies of the software are available from SoundField for use in educational environments.

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Version 1.17 from Soundscape

Soundscape Digital will be launching V1.17 software at this year's exhibition. This version, aimed primarily at TV and film post, will feature editing on-the-fly, EDL file support of CMX, Grass Valley, and Sony formats, auto conform, waveform buffering, 29.97 and 29.97 DF SMPTE formats, time stamping, sound effect/take file archiving, JL Cooper PPS100 and Penny and Giles MM16 hardware control interfaces.

This digital audio workstation for the IBM/PC, which can be expanded

from eight to 128 physical tracks, has been installed in over 2,000 locations over the past 20 months, in many prestigious locations. Despite this, there are several countries in Asia where Soundscape is not currently represented exclusively so Soundscape are inviting distributors to visit their stand for a demonstration.

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ARX launches
